Dear Monterey County and District Superintendents, Charter School Administrators and High School Principals:

We are writing today to encourage your participation in the 2nd annual Civic Learning Award for California public high schools co-sponsored by California Chief Justice Tani Cantil-Sakauye and California State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tom Torlakson. The award program aims to raise awareness about the importance of learning about how our national, state and local governments operate as part of the curriculum in our schools. The award program will spotlight successful efforts to engage students in civic learning and identify models that can be replicated in other schools.

Chief Justice Cantil-Sakauye and Superintendent Torlakson will announce three levels of award winners acknowledged for Excellence, Distinction, and Merit in mid-February 2014. Award of Distinction winners will be visited by an Appellate Court Justice, and a Superior Court Judge will provide recognition to schools receiving the Award of Merit.
