Certified Temporary Judge Program

Applications are now being accepted for the Monterey County Superior Court Temporary Judge Program for the areas of Small Claims, Domestic Violence Restraining Orders, Civil Harassment Restraining Orders, Workplace Violence Restraining Orders, Elder Abuse Restraining Orders and Traffic. The Court maintains a list of certified volunteer attorneys willing to serve intermittently as a temporary judge when the Court needs judicial assistance that it cannot provide using its full-time judicial officers.

Minimum Qualifications

In addition to being in compliance with California Rules of Court 2.812, you must be in good standing and have been admitted to practice law as a member of the State Bar of California for ten years. For good cause, the Court may permit an attorney who has been admitted to practice for at least 5 years to serve as a temporary judge.

Among the qualifications the Court will consider is litigation experience, areas of specialization and interest and ability to commit to intermittent assignments.
